## 2019 Seedling Judging Division 3 Class 301

Judges: Don Hollingsworth, Scott Parker, Nate Bremer

- 1) Seedling HNTSM. Herbaceous hybrid. Not open at time of judging. Exhibitor: Tim Stanek
- 2) **Seedling BJ#10.** Herbaceous hybrid. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Full single stage double with progressive transformation. Superior coloration and well formed flower. Exhibitor: Adleman Peonies, Bob Johnson seedling
- 3) **Seedling Sdlg I Yel.** Herbaceous hybrid. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Full single stage double with progressive transformation. Large rounded petals. Full formed yellow flowers. Exhibitor: Tim Stanek.
- 4) **Seedling Tolomeo Seedling.** Herbaceous hybrid. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Single red. Cup shaped single form with good petal substance. Red petals wide and rounded. Red stigmas, Anthers have red mid-line bisecting yellow halves. Clean flower that is well formed. Exhibitor: Adelman Peonies
- 5) **Seedling Roselette's Baby.** Herbaceous hybrid. Not awarded. Magenta single form flowers. Average floral display. 2 rows of rounded petals that lack uniformity. Stem have crook. Exhibitor: Adelman Peonies.
- 6) **Seedling 3442.** Herbaceous hybrid. Awarded Certificate of Merit and advanced to Court of Honor as best herbaceous seedling. Large medium yellow 2 stage double. Very full form with highly organized petal structure. Petals notched at outer edges. A number of petals had red wire edges adding beauty and intrigue. Superior. Exhibitor: Don Hollingsworth.
- 7) **Seedling TNSGL.** Herbaceous hybrid. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Large single cream-pink blushed flowers that open flat. Deep pink stigmas create excellent contrast. Durable anthers do not shed pollen easily to disfigure flowers. Excellent symmetry. Petals broaden at ends and are creped. Exhibitor: Tim Stanek
- 8) **Seedling H1717.** Herbaceous hybrid. Single coral red with two rows of petals. Pleasant coloration. Stems have slight crook. Semi-cupped form. Average overall floral display. Exhibitor: Don Hollingsworth.
- 9) **Seedling PF.** Herbaceous hybrid. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Light coral- pink colored two stage double. Has side buds. Extra early for this color. Petals notched throughout. Has pollen, but does not easily visible. Exhibitor: Tim Stanek
- 10) **Seedling H3282.** Herbaceous hybrid. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Cream-white petals with tan-pink inner glow (petal bases have tan-pink blush). Petals creased along length are ruffled and have notched and toothed outer edges. Full two stage double. Excellent stems beneath flowers. Exhibitor: Don Hollingsworth.
- 11) **Seedling Pink Pine.** Woody peony. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Rockii x suff lineage. Semi-double. Deep red sheath and stigmas. Filament deep red at base. Small brushed flares of deep lavender. Overall flower color is medium lavender. Large outer petals with interior rows becoming smaller. Petals variably notched. Uniform opening flower. Exhibitor: Tim Stanek.
- 12) **Seedling Seneca Hills.** Woody peony. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Rockii lineage. Single to semi double deep pink flowers with darker red-lavender flares. Flares have bleeding edges, approximately 1/6<sup>th</sup> of length. Filaments and stigmas are deep lavender. Sheath a light lavender. Extremely thick stems below flowers. Exhibitor: Lois Girton.
- 13) **Seedling GWRS12**. Woody peony. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Rockii x suff lineage. Hot coral pink petals. Purple-maroon stigmas, filaments and sheath-striking contrast with petal color. Semi-double. Petals are ruffled, notched and have light scalloping. Maroon brushed flares extend 1/4<sup>th</sup> of petal length. Don Hollingsworth.

- 14) **Seedling BHND.** Woody peony. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Rockii? X suff lineage. Large semi-double flower. Raspberry pink. Large muted flares are a deeper shade of raspberry and with a gradual delineation between petal color and flare. Stigmas match petal color. Sheath and stigmas deep raspberry-purple. Exhibitor: Tim Stanek
- 15) **Seedling GWRS15.** Woody peony. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Rockii x suffruticosa lineage. Large light lavender petals with small scalloped edges. Light semi-double. Prominent deep black-purple flares extend approximate 1/4<sup>th</sup> of petal length. Flares have veined appearance at outer edges. Sheath and filaments are burgundy. Stigmas are reddish purple. Exhibitor: Don Hollingsworth.
- 16) **Seedling TP Sdlg N**. Woody peony. Awarded Certificate of Merit and advanced to Court of Honor as best woody seedling. Rockii? X suffruticosa lineage. Wide pink raspberry petals recurve slightly at their midpoint creating an outstanding floral display. Petals have heavier texture and color saturation from the halfway point of the petals inward. White sheath and yellow-white stigmas. Raspberry stigmas. 3 rows of petals create a single to semi-double flower. Flower opens wide to reveal contrasting filaments and sheath color. No apparent flares. Large showy bloom of unique form and coloration. Large straight stems below flower. Exhibitor: Tim Stanek.
- 17) **Seedling GWRS09.** Woody peony. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Rockii x suffruticosa lineage. Large baby ribbon pink flowers with two rows of petals. Maroon-red flares are feathered and extend 1/3 outward from the bases of the petals. Red-pink sheath and filaments. Pink stigmas. Superior contrast of reproductive structures to petals. Exhibitor: Don Hollingsworth.
- 18) **Seedling GWRS16.** Woody peony. Awarded Certificate of Merit. Rockii x suffruticosa lineage. Large white flower of semi-double form. Improved Rock's Variety in appearance-more double. Highly consistent petal formation. See a Rock's Variety description for color details. Exhibitor: Don Hollingsworth
- 19) **Seedling SmDbl.** Woody peony. Not awarded due to inconsistencies in petals and damage throughout. Suffruticosa cultivar. This type of flower is typically difficult to show due to light substance of petals and excessive pollen shedding at early stages of opening. Tim Stanek

## **Newly Registered Cultivars-Division 3 Class 302**

- 20) **Heather.** Herbaceous hybrid. Awarded Certificate of Merit. See peony registry for detailed description. Outstanding and consistent throughout. Should prove to be an excellent show flower as display is uniform and symmetric. Extremely pleasing to view! Don Hollingsworth.
- 21) **Faithful Dream.** Newly registered cultivar. Herbaceous hybrid. Not judged as flowers were not open at time of judging. Tim Stanek.
