No plans in the works, but see below. Online registry serves the needs, and plan to make available an online checklist to compliment the one published in 2007.

Where do you publish new registrations? Remember the registration process is only complete once the registration is published in hard copy. Please give details.

Previously (to end of 2018), new registrations were published quarterly in the APS Bulletin. Recently, the increased volume of registrations has made this unsustainable because the registrations reduced space available for regular Bulletin features. Beginning in 2019, names of registered peonies are published quarterly, and at the end of the year a Directory of New Cultivars devoted exclusively to registrations for that year is published. This Directory was distributed to all members and has met with a very positive response. Are you aware of any significant gaps in your current or historical records? If so, please indicate how you hope to deal with them.

There are of course many cultivars of Eastern European origin from behind the former "Iron Curtain" which are unknown to us, and for which names and descriptions are not readily available. This also applies to many of those from China, Japan, and other countries from that region. We anticipate that with access to the online registry, those people with knowledge of these will make us aware of them. This is already happening in small degree.

Have you undertaken any other activities to promote registration in this reporting period e.g. other publications, lectures, conventions etc.? Please give details.

No we have not. For us, anything in this regard would be like preaching to the already converted. We could not do better than the online registry, which is freely available to anyone in the internet community. The tables above show a marked increase in registrations since we went online with this. We are continuously updating the information, especially with photographs as we find them, and so this trend should continue.
